Extraction of mandibular teeth. For teeth in the lower left quadrant, the operator stands much as for maxillary extractions , but the patient can be placed a few inches lower. When the operator's back is straight and the forceps are applied to the tooth, both of the operator's wrists should be in a comfortable neutral position.
